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
Wheelchair accessibility on Karak Bidi

Section 1 Paul Hasluck Reserve to Birdwood Park

The Karak Bidi follows a short narrow sealed pathway that is a little steeper than ideal to connect with Birdwood Parade. The alternate option is to follow the Esplanade north before heading west on Bessell Avenue. At the top of the hill turn left onto Birdwood Parade to reconnect with the Karak Bidi at Birdwood Park.




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Section 2 KARRAKATTA CEMETERY

Sections within Karrakatta Cemetery are formed from unsealed crushed limestone. Roads are level however to avoid these sectors, follow the alternate links shown here.

- 1) Entry from Government Road—follow Loftus Street before turning right to re-join the trail.
- 2) To avoid the unsealed level sector past the American War Memorial, follow the road to the right and back left onto John Curtin Avenue.
- 3) If avoiding the top sector of unsealed roadway, continue straight to Broome Street and left onto Carrington Street to follow the perimeter of the Karrakatta Cemetery.
- 4) Continuing within the Cemetery, the access to Hollywood Reserve is narrow and sandy. A short distance further within Karrakatta offers the opportunity to enter Hollywood Reserve on a sealed level pathway.



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Section 3 HOLLYWOOD RESERVE

Follow the sealed pathway to the war graves where the pathway becomes unsealed and constructed of crushed limestone but fairly level. Accessible options include;

1. Exit onto Smythe Road past the war graves at this point to avoid the unsealed pathway.
2. Continue straight following the crushed limestone and re-join the Karak Bidi where it exits onto Smythe Road near to the Bowles Club. (See dotted line for level unsealed pathway). The loop to the west is a narrow sand path.
